SUBMISSION OF PAPERS

The deadline for submission of papers for the ICETRAN conference is extended to April 30th, 2017.

Camera-ready full manuscripts should be prepared in accordance with the Guide that can be downloaded from the ETRAN Society website (www.etran.rs). All submitted papers will be peer-reviewed. Manuscripts must be submitted via EasyChair Conference Managing System.

SCOPE

The conference IcETRAN is organized in 17 sections dedicated to the following topics: electronics, telecommunications, computing and information engineering, automation, nuclear engineering and technology, acoustics, antennas and propagation, artificial intelligence, power engineering, electric circuits and systems and signal processing, biomedical engineering, metrology, microelectronics and optoelectronics, microwave technique, technologies and systems, new materials in electrical and electronic engineering, robotics and flexible automation, and education in electrical, electronic and computing engineering.

In addition to that, nanoETRAN workshop dedicated to nanosciences and nanotechnologies in electrical and electronic engineering will be held within the Microelectronics and Optoelectronics section.

AWARDS

Each section of the ETRAN Society grants the **Best Paper Award** and the **Best Young Author Paper Award**. The recipients are chosen among the authors from both of the co-located ETRAN Society conferences. In order to be eligible for the best young researcher's paper award, the young researcher must be the principal author and must personally present the paper. The awarded authors have free registration at the next year's ETRAN meeting. Moreover, awarded young authors have free hotel accommodation for two days for at the next year's ETRAN meeting.

PROCEEDINGS

Papers will be published in the conference proceedings which will be available on-line to increase the visibility of the research results presented. Only papers accepted for the Conference and presented by one of the registered authors will be included in the proceedings.

The extended versions of all awarded papers of young authors will be published free of charge in the open access research journal Serbian Journal of Electrical Engineering.

Extended versions of all other awarded papers will be published free of charge in one of the following open access research journals: Serbian Journal of Electrical Engineering, Telecommunications, Microwave review, Electronics and Facta Universitatis.

REGISTRATION

Each IcETRAN conference participant with a regular contribution is requested to pay the registration fee with the ETRAN Society. Registration is free for participants awarded during the previous IcETRAN Conference. Registration fees are the following: regular = $150 \, \text{\ensuremath{\notin}}$; IEEE members = $120 \, \text{\ensuremath{\notin}}$, collective members of ETRAN Society = $80 \, \text{\ensuremath{\notin}}$, students = $50 \, \text{\ensuremath{\notin}}$. The student fee is valid for undergraduate students (< 24 years of age), master students (< 27 years) and PhD students (< 30 years).

SPECIAL OFFER: 50% discount to registration fee and free accommodation for two nights, breakfast included at the "Đerdap" Hotel is valid for each young author who is the first author of an ICETRAN 2017 paper and:

- 1. Bachelor degree students: born after June 08, 1992.
- 2. Master degree students: born after June 08, 1989
- 3. Doctoral students: born after June 08, 1986.
- 4. Young researchers who were awarded PhD degree after June, 08, 2015 and were born after June, 13, 1981.

The meeting will take place in the hotel "Đerdap", Kladovo, Serbia. City of Kladovo is on the Danube river, near the large power plant "Đerdap" about 245 km far from Belgrade. The hotel is overseeing the Danube river, and is across the city Turnu Severin (Romania). Kladovo is nearby the Iron Gate, a touristic spot where the Danube is the deepest. There are many traces of Serbian history along the road from Belgrade to Kladovo (e.g, Viminacium, "Tabula Traiana", "Traians Bridge", "Golubac Fortress", "Ram Fortress", archaeological site of "Lepenski Vir").
